# Upcoming Events

## Show and Tell

Unfortunately, we do not have pictures for Show and Tell this month. We went immediately into the demonstration.

### **Demonstrations**

#### June Demo

Chris Stott did the June demonstration.

He began by doing a "skew" exercise. He demonstrated how to turn a taper that he then inserted in the Morse taper to hold the piece. He turned a captured ring on a slender spindle for the skew exercise.

He then demonstrated how to use eccentric turning to create a feminine form. By using 3 axes, he was able to turn a very stylistic feminine form by mounting and remounting the piece on each of the axes. He noted that you must sand and finish each axis mounting because it would be nearly

impossible to remount in exactly the same place.

Unfortunately, we do not have photos of his session at this time. If we get them later, they will be included in a later newsletter. •
