## Demonstrations

We were lucky to have Steve Sinner, who is internationally known for his patina'd silver overlay on hollow forms.



Mr. Sinner himself.



Samples of his silver patina overlay. He patinas the silver using an solution of a pea-sized piece sulfurated potash dissolved in 2 oz. of distilled water. The solution is good for up to 2 weeks.



His Nautical Men vase. He uses paper to wick the sulfurated potash solution to exactly where he wants it to create these “photo-negative” images.



Close-ups of the guarded ring tools he prefers. The top one is the Rawley Munroe tool. The bottom one is the Exoset hollowing tool.
