Turning Challenge Rules

Here are the rules for the Turning Challenge.

Category – Typically, each month's challenge is the topic from the previous month's demonstration, unless otherwise indicated in the newsletter.

Competing – Please fill out a Show and Tell form for your competition piece and be sure to mark whether you think you are a Beginner, Intermediate, or Advanced turner.

Voting – Please vote once for each experience class. For example, you can vote once for a Beginner, once for an Intermediate, and once for an Advanced piece. Votes are tallied after the break and the winners announced.

You don't have to compete in the Turning Challenge, but it can be fun. Remember that you can bring other types of turnings for the Show and Tell, too.

Group Purchases and Individual Catalog Orders

Roger Holmes and Del Fussell are the Group Buy Coordinators for 2008. They provide opportunities for FRW members to achieve substantial savings through Group Buy ordering. Order forms will be available at meetings and are also posted on the FRW website. See the Group Buy schedule below. Following meetings where group buy orders are taken, additional orders will be accepted if received by the respective group buy coordinator by the following Tuesday. If the minimum order amount is not reached, the ordering period will be extended to the following month. Ordered items are normally distributed at the next monthly meeting. Please make checks payable to the listed group buy coordinator.

Industrial Abrasives: Group Buy minimum order of \$50. Discounted prices for mandrels and sanding disks are on the provided order form, no tax, and 5% shipping. If you desire to include in your order other items in the IA catalog – such as sheets of Velcro sandpaper or specialized sanding items for your shop machinery – the purchase price is either (a) the price on the wholesale list or (b) 10% discount if not on the wholesale list. A 10% shipping charge applies to these other item orders. Contact Del Fussell.

<u>Starbond:</u> (CA Glue): Group Buy minimum order of \$100. Discounted prices are on the provided order form, no tax, no shipping. Contact Del Fussell.

<u>Craft Supplies:</u> Group Buy minimum order of \$1,000. Discounts vary but are at least 13% (excluding machinery and items that require special shipping charges). No tax, no shipping. Contact Roger Holmes.

<u>Woodcarvers Supply:</u> Group Buy minimum order of \$170 (prior to discount). 10% discount on everything in the catalog. No tax, but \$7.50 is charged for shipping each order (split

among those who order). Contact Roger Holmes

Rockler Greenwood End Sealer – One-Time Buy: Roger Holmes will be taking orders in February for Rockler greenwood end sealer at \$12.00 per gallon (no tax, no shipping) (the normal store price is \$19.99). The Group Buy minimum order is 8 gallons. Cash or checks payable to Rockler.

Individual Catalog Orders allow members to place orders with the below vendors at a discount and have the items shipped directly to your door. You must first sign up for individual catalog discounts. It is FRW's policy that we do not provide full member rosters to vendors, so if you want to tap into these discounts, please be sure to sign up on the sheets that are passed around at each meeting.

Klingspor - Individual Catalog Orders: 10% discounts on all catalog items. It is easier to order by phone, identify yourself as being a FRW member. If you order on-line, however, first send an email to sales@woodworkingshop.com with your username (format is first name + last initial - i.e., John Smith would be "johns"), billing address, phone # and preferred password, and identify yourself as a FRW member. You will receive a confirmation email within 2 business days that will enable you to order on-line.

Hartville Tool - Individual Catalog Orders: 20% discount on all catalog items until about October 2008 - then drops to 15%. Call in your order, and identify yourself as being a FRW member. No tax, but catalog shipping charges on orders under \$300 (under \$75 through January 10, 2008) apply.

Welcome to the FRW Library! We are well along to the way to completing a detailed audit of library functions and video inventory. An updated inventory will be available on the library cabinet. Please request the library item by its reference number on the list.

Following are the FRW Library Rules that will be effective January 2008.

- Sign-outs of videos and books are for one month only except for the period of November thru January. If you cannot attend the next meeting, either (a) mail them to Dave Hawley before the next meeting, or (b) drop them in the slot in the FRW library cabinet downstairs at Rockler. Please do not leave them with Rockler people we don't want to burden them with the responsibility.
- Each month, a member in good standing may sign out a total of 3 videos and 3 books. Any DVD or video set will have each item counted separately (e.g., 3-item set maxes out the total).
- Members may sign up on a waiting list for a maximum of 3 videos. If more than one person is on the list for the same item, the first person has until the end

of the first five minutes of the break to check out the item, else the next person on the list can get it.

 Members who are past due on library items cannot check out additional items.

- Check with your email provider to see if they are filtering your email without you knowing.
- If your email provider allows you, add the following email addresses to your "Always Allow" or "Do Not Filter" list: You may receive the newsletter from any of these addresses.
